## Definitions and features of culture

#### Culture

the customs, institutions, and achievements of a particular

nation, people or group.

Culture (capital 'C') talking about Culture in general

culture (little 'c') talking about a specific culture eg. Maori culture

**Culture is...** ⊙ <u>learnt</u> from birth

• shared by people

• dynamic\*- it changes over time and adapts to new challenges (such

as being moved from land or meeting other cultures)

\*dynamic means "always changing"

<u>Culture is different to race and ethnicity</u>, but often people who share an ethnicity also share culture and race. Ethnicity tends to be specific to place, whereas culture is not.

**Race** is determined by physical features such as skin colour and shape of nose or

brow

**Ethnicity** is determined by a person's sense of belonging to an ethnic group (group of

people sharing the same race, homeland, language, heritage, historical and

religious background)

### Some features of Culture include:

family relationships, rules, language, cooking/food, art, education, myths, religion, clothing/dress, music and symbols
